## From Interstate 8

## From Montezuma Road

Heading east on Montezuma Rd. make a left turn (north) at 55th St. Heading west on Montezuma Rd. make a right turn at 55th St.

Follow 55th St. to Aztec Circle Dr. and make a right turn. Enter Parking Structure 4 (PS 4). Please park on Levels 1-3.
