- Non-profit organizations
- For-Profit organizations
- Local jurisdictions

Awards will be presented to winners at WalkSanDiego's Annual Awards Gala on Thursday, April 22, 2010.

While individuals nominated for an award may not submit their own nomination, nominators may ask a nominee for information that will be used in his/her nomination. The selection and nomination process is relatively simple, but requires that you provide a brief description of the nominee and include a discussion of how the nominee conforms to the attached Golden Footprint Award Criteria. To a ***Non-profit or For-Profit Organization*** that:

- Has provided unique or outstanding support to pedestrians
- Has taken risks and gone above and beyond the call of duty to support walkability and pedestrian advocacy
- Has positively impacted a significant number of people in a community
- Serves as an example for other businesses or organizations locally and nationally

To a ***Local Jurisdiction*** that:

- Has taken unusual risk or initiative to support walkability initiatives and pedestrian rights
- Has prioritized projects and programs that increase walkability and pedestrian safety
- Serves as an example for other agencies locally and nationally
- Has positively impacted a significant number of people in a community
